The Regular Municipal Health Holdings meeting was held on September 14, 2015. The Village of Meota withdrew their membership from the organization (NSRMHH). They felt their per capita contribution was too high for the value they received. Many of the residents use North Battleford for medical services. Lab Services are still an issue in the District. St. Walburg's position

has not yet been filled. Judy Kozinski is providing us with 2 day a week lab coverage. Please continue to bring this issue to the attention of your MLA's and Prairie North Board Members. The Lab-Tech position is still posted as a .8 position which means St. Walburg would have a Lab-Tech 4 days a week and 1 day would be in another community.

The Dr. situation appears to be stable at this time.
