The Town of St. Walburg embarked on a rebranding of the website in 2019. The site was brought online October 31, 2019. We have completely redesigned the site. The Town continues to add information on a weekly basis, so please check back. If you would like to see any features or information, be sure to let the Town Office know.

RECYCLING & WASTE COLLECTION

It has been brought to our attention that many items that are being thrown into the recycle bin **should not be in there**. We have found many bags of garbage, clothing, etc. The Town would like to encourage the use of clear and/or blue see-through bags.

Bad things happen when the wrong items are placed in the Recycle bins. How Bad? Bad enough that it can damage equipment, cause workplace injuries at the recycling facility and ruin otherwise perfectly good recycle. There may be additional costs for the bin to be disposed of as garbage instead of being recycled.

The Town will be closely monitoring, and should this continue, the bins will be locked and appointments will have to be made through the Town Office to bring access the bins.

The Town of St. Walburg would appreciate the co-operation of everyone who uses the Recycle Bins.

Transfer is now open by appointments only.

Please call Town Office to set up an appointment.

Garbage collection will ONLY be Tuesday mornings. Please have all garbage out before 7 a.m. Town garbage bags are available at Kim's service and the Town Office at a cost of \$3/each.

SNOW REMOVAL PROCEDURES

The Town would like to remind all residents to be aware of the snow removal procedures for the 2019-2020 season.

A Dial-my-calls Broadcast will be sent out prior to the Town Staff clearing snow, with a minimum of 24 Hours notice. The high priority areas are the emergency routes and the heavy truck routes. The broadcast will ask all residents to move parked vehicles from the street to assist with the removal process. As a precaution, the Town equipment may leave a ridge around each vehicle that has not been moved to assist with the process to avoid damage.

When there is a snowfall of 4" in one instance, the Town may begin snow removal during the evenings, and on weekends to keep the emergency routes accessible. The Town Office has a route map of the snow removal areas, feel free to stop by and take a look.

SIDEWALKS & SNOW REMOVAL

For pedestrians safety, please keep all sidewalks cleared of snow, ice, and debris. The Town has a bylaw that requires all snow, ice, and debris to be removed within 48 hours of a snowfall. For more information, please contact the Town Office.

THE WALKER NEUMANN MEMORIAL AWARD

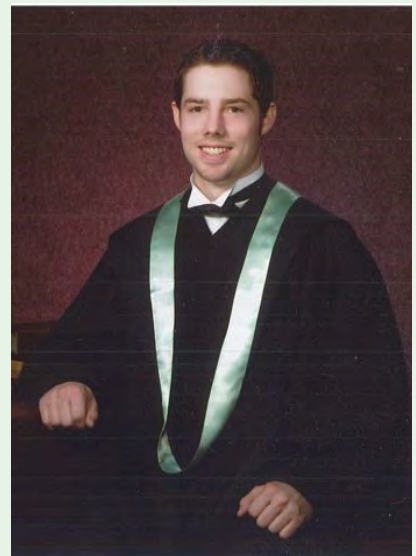
We are pleased to share with community members and friends that NuVista Energy Ltd. has established an evergreen scholarship titled the Walker Neumann Memorial Award in memory of Walker Neumann who passed away November 2018 in Calgary, Alberta, at the age of 34 years.

Walker was a small-town farm kid who grew up right here in St. Walburg, Saskatchewan where he attended both elementary school and high school. Walker was a true and loyal friend, considerate and thoughtful, helpful and kind, caring and encouraging. Walker's natural empathy enabled him to make close connections with all types of individuals. He grew up with a passion for the energy industry in which he, his father Dale, and his grandfather all worked. This passion led him to pursue his Bachelor of Science in Geology at the University of Saskatchewan.

Walker joined NuVista Energy in 2012 as a Geologist after a successful start to his career with Talisman energy Inc., where he joined following graduation. He led his NuVista team in such a way that exemplified leadership. He gave energy, commitment and inspiration to everyone with whom he worked. He had a sense of humor, was bright, logical and systematic in his thinking. He was passionately interested in all things geology and this passion was infectious. Two of our favorite memories are of Walker wearing a lab-coat expounding the "Joys of Rock" while explaining what a piece of rock core revealed; and cracking a special single malt with his team after overseeing the drilling of a particularly successful well (this happened a lot). He generously gave us his knowledge, his expertise, his skills and most importantly, his friendship.

We at NuVista are honored to share in keeping the memory of Walker alive through the Walker Neumann Memorial Award in Geology. This scholarship has been established with the University of Saskatchewan by NuVista Energy Ltd in fond memory of Walker, recognizing his natural approach to leadership and his exceptional geological skills.
