COMPOST SITE

The Town has noted recently that there are **unacceptable items being placed at the Compost Site**. The site was established to assist our residents in getting rid of organic materials. However, as of lately, there has been **food waste and garbage** at the site. Food waste encourages rodents and small animals (fox, skunks, bears) to frequent the site. This is becoming a concern for the area.

Acceptable materials include: pine needles and cones, leaves and twigs, wood chips, grass clippings, tree prunings and stumps and untreated wood.

RECYCLING & WASTE COLLECTION

It has been brought to our attention that many items that are being thrown into the recycle bin **should not be in there**. We have found many bags of garbage, clothing, etc. The Town would like to encourage the use of clear and/or blue see-through bags.

Bad things happen when the wrong items are placed in the Recycle bins. How Bad? Bad enough that it can damage equipment, cause workplace injuries at the recycling facility and ruin otherwise perfectly good recycle. There may be additional costs for the bin to be disposed of as garbage instead of being recycled.

The Town will be closely monitoring, and should this continue, the bins will be locked and appointments will have to be made through the Town Office to bring access the bins.

The Town of St. Walburg would appreciate the co-operation of everyone who uses the Recycle Bins.

St. Walburg Waste Disposal will be closing for the season as soon as weather conditions become too cold for our operator.

Garbage collection will ONLY be Tuesday morning after September 30th, 2019. Please have all garbage out before 7 a.m. Town garbage bags are available at Kim's service and the Town Office at a cost of \$3/each.

CAMPGROUND CLOSURE FOR THE 2019 SEASON

The Town would like to thank the volunteers of the St. Walburg Tourism & Heritage Society for managing and operating the Campground for another successful year.

The St. Walburg Campground is in the process of shutting down for the season on October 15, 2019. Water will remain connected at the back tap until the end of October. Power will be available to the front sites and garbage collection will continue. The rate will be reduced as of October 15, 2019 to \$15.00/night.

SNOW REMOVAL PROCEDURES

The Town would like to remind all residents to be aware of the snow removal procedures for the 2019-2020 season.

A Dial-my-calls Broadcast will be sent out prior to the Town Staff clearing snow, with a minimum of 24 Hours notice. The high priority areas are the emergency routes and the heavy truck routes. The broadcast will ask all residents to move parked vehicles from the street to assist with the removal process. As a precaution, the Town equipment may leave a ridge around each vehicle that has not been moved to assist with the process to avoid damage.

When there is a snowfall of 4" in one instance, the Town may begin snow removal during the evenings, and on weekends to keep the emergency routes accessible. The Town Office has a route map of the snow removal areas, feel free to stop by and take a look.

SIGNING CORRIDOR—BYLAW 2019-14

Upon a recommendation from the Department of Highways, the Town of St. Walburg has reviewed the Signing Corridor bylaw and adopted a revised bylaw that takes the regulations administered by the Ministry of Highways in consideration. The Town of St. Walburg currently has a North and South Signing Corridor. The South Corridor has been managed over the years by D. & G. Schlekewy (Owner of the adjacent property). The Town has adopted an updated application form and will require the existing advertising businesses to contact the Town Office for the updated information. Correspondence will be sent in the next coming months to all current sign holders.

The new fee schedule will begin January 2020 and will be administered and managed by the Town Office. Should there be any questions, please contact the Town Office at (306) 248-3232.

SEWER BYLAW NO. 4-2009

The Town will be working on sewer flushing over the next month. As per Bylaw 4-2009, all owners shall, at their own expense, maintain the building sewer from the building to the property line. Grease, oil, and sand interceptors are to be installed on each property for all garages and vehicle/equipment washing establishments. (*This is a reminder to clean out those interceptors, and safely dispose of the contents—not into the sanitary sewer line.) The interceptors are to be maintained by the owner at his expense in continuously efficient operation at all times. The Town Office will be following up with Public Health to ensure that the interceptors are in working order. During the spring flushing it was noted of several areas that had a build up within the lines, and the Town would like to encourage all property owners to be aware of the possible costs if there is evidence of oversized solids entering the sewer system. When the sewer flushing occurs, it allows Town Staff to inspect and observe the condition of the sewer lines. If such an inspection discloses any failure, omission, or neglect, the Town will send notification to the owner, proprietor, or occupier of a property to rectify, at their expense, the cause of the complaint, when that cause arises out of the portion of the connection from the property line to the building. In the cause any blockage is caused by failure, omission, or neglect to comply with the interceptor installation, the owner, proprietor, or occupier, will be liable to the Town for all costs of clearing such blockage, in addition to any penalty for infraction of Bylaw 4-2009.

FIRE PREVENTION AND PROTECTION

The Town provides fire protection and the suppression for the residents of St. Walburg and surrounding communities. Effective January 1, 2020 the rates for any call outs for the St. Walburg and District Fire Rescue Association will be as per the Saskatchewan Government Insurance (S.G.I.) rates. Currently the call out rate is \$937.65 per hour. This amount will be prorated for each additional hour of service for fire suppression. The Town will also be implementing that a maximum charge to each affected property owner will be \$5,000.00, with any costs that exceed \$5,000.00 per property be invoiced to the Town of St. Walburg. This came from a recommendation of the St. Walburg and District Fire Rescue Associations' meeting held on March 29, 2019. Fire Prevention Week is October 6-12—"Not every hero wears a cape. Plan and practice your escape!" is this years theme. This is a reminder that we need to take personal steps to increase our safety from fire and how to escape safety in the event of one. 1. Look for places a fire could start—identify potential fire hazards and take care of them. 2. Listen for the sound of the smoke alarm—you could only have minutes to escape safety once the smoke alarm sounds, go to your meeting place that is a safe distance away from the home. 3. Learn two ways out of every room and make sure all doors and windows leading outside open easily and are free of clutter.

Water Meter Replacement



Over the past few months, the Iconix Waterworks has been working hard to exchange the water meters in our community. There are a handful left to be changed out, which will be completed by the Utilities Supervisor in the near future. Each meter is equipped with a radio beacon that uploads the usage data to a master database. The Town is able to monitor each of the accounts. This technology reduces the time it takes to read every single meter. Once the Town is confident that the system is up and running, we will be offering an app for any resident who wishes to monitor their account.
