GARDENING TIPS FROM LOCAL EXPERTS

Take 4 tums, 1/4 cup Epson salts & a in holes before planting tomato plants.

Always plant tomato plants up to their leaves.



- When planting onions, put ashes in the rows before putting your onions. This will prevent worms.
- To get rid of ants, mix 3 tbsp. dawn dish soap, 2 tbsp. baking soda with 1 gallon water. Repeat this two days in a row.
- Plant an onion at each end of row when planting carrot seeds. It will help to mark your rows.



SMART WATERING TIPS

Getting smart with how we water isn't just about conserving it—it's also common sense. It can save time and money, and the plants will be all the better for it. The top tips are:



- plants need it
- Water at the Right Time—early in the morning gives the plants time to absorb the moisture
- Aim Carefully—the base of the plants land control (proof are where it's needed

With the lack of moisture in our community, the RM of Frenchman Butte No. 501 cut up banana peel add water and put has granted permission to any resident within their boundaries to use the Community Wells. The closest well to St. Walburg is west of the Municipal Cemetery on Highway 26 South. Community wells are non-potable water intended for agriculture use.

> There are two Community Wells located within the RM of Frenchman Butte No. 501:

NE 29-53-22 W3 & SW 35-53-24 W3.

Council has reduced the price of bulk water for the month of August 2021. Clean, safe potable bulk water is available from the Water Treatment Plant at a reduced cost of \$5.00 per cubic meter.

Water Security Agency has advised that due to the current conditions across the province, that under the Water Security Agency Act, all lands that touch the shoreline of the water area have the riparian right to use/withdraw water from the slough for domestic purposes until such time as the water recedes off of their property. Individuals whom do not own property touched by the waters of Water Selectively-only water if the the slough are required to obtain a Temporary Water Rights License from the Water security Agency. The license (if

granted) will require the applicant to obtain written of permission) Trap Water—use upturned bottles from all property surrounding the slough area. Water Security applicaat the Town Office.

BULK WATER

Clean, safe potable bulk water is available in St. Walburg at the Water Treatment Plant on 4th Street West at a cost of \$9.20 per cubic meter. Council has reduced the price for the month of August 2021 to \$5.00 per cubic meter. To purchase water at this self-serve, prepaid station you will need to purchase a preloaded Prepaid Water Cards can be card. purchased at Kim's Service and are preloaded with \$20 credit. You can also purchase prepaid Water Cards (loaded with any amount) at the Town Office during regular business hours that can be reloaded and used indefinitely. Bulk Water cards do require a \$10 deposit per card, that is refundable when returned.
