This ice rink is a natural rink that is dependent on weather conditions for ice quality.

- Individuals should wash their hands before and after using any recreational area.

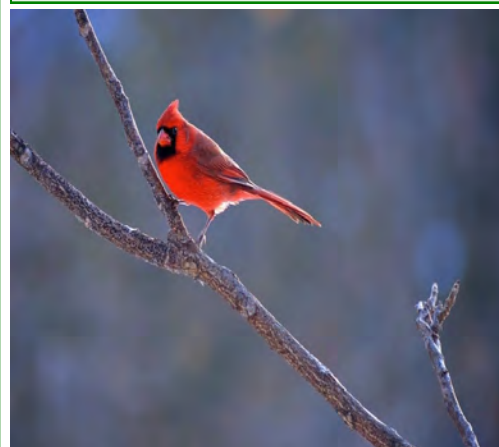

Saskatchewan's current public health order has been extend to February 28, 2022

Mandatory Masking Indoor Spaces

Under the current public health order, masking is mandatory in all indoor public spaces including schools, and proof of vaccination or negative test requirements are in place for public access to a list of establishments, businesses and event venues.

Indoor public spaces are any enclosed space other than a private home or dwelling. This may include but is not exclusive to workplaces, retail locations, recreational venues, eating and dining establishments and professional buildings. Indoor public spaces include those areas of business or venue that are restricted to staff only (areas where there is no access for the public).

Eligibility:

All Saskatchewan residents ages 5 and older are eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine. A second dose of the vaccine can be provided 28 days after receiving the first dose.

All residents 18 years or older are eligible for a third dose, three months following their second dose.

The Town Office in St. Walburg is a Saskatchewan Ministry of Health approved Testing Location. Anyone requiring proof of negative COVID-19 TEST CAN BE TESTED AT THE Town Office—134 Main Street. You will be provided with a verified, negative test certificate that includes your name, birthday, type of test, date and time of sample collection, test results, and will be signed by a Certified Test Operator.

Get results in 15 minutes (we strive to email your results in under 1 hour).

ANNUAL 2022 RENEWALS DUE

Permit to operate an All Terrain Vehicle licenses are due yearly in January. Please stop in the Town Office and renew your plate. If you no longer require this permit, please return the license plate to the Town Office. Proof of current insurance is required.

All cats and dogs must be licensed and need to be renewed every year. A pet licence is a unique ID that tells us your pet belongs to you. It allows us to reunite the two of you more quickly if your pet ever gets lost or displaced in an emergency.

Business licence renewals are due for 2022. Once payment is received, an updated licence will be sent to you by mail.

COMMUNICATION

The Town Office has been using Dial-My-Calls Broadcasting Service to get information out to the residents of St. Walburg. The service allows the Town Staff to contact many individuals at once, which is time saving. However, the system is only successful with **Current Up-to-Date information**. Please ensure that proper contact information is in the Town database. In the event of an Emergency, the Town needs to be able to communicate with all residents.

ST. WALBURG GRANT APPLICATION
