Thank you to each and every one of you for participating and make St. Walburg a little brighter this holiday season! Approximately 80 properties were decorated this holiday season.



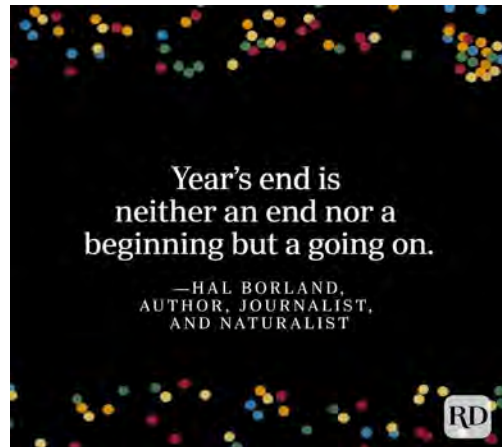

SIDEWALK & SNOW REMOVAL

For pedestrians safety, please keep all sidewalks cleared. The Town has a bylaw that requires all snow, ice and debris to be removed within 48 hours of snowfall. For more information, please contact the Town Office.

SNOW REMOVAL PROCEDURES

The Town would like to remind all residents to be aware of the snow removal procedures for the 2021-2022 season. A Dial-my-calls Broadcast will be sent out prior to the Town Staff clearing snow, with a minimum of 24 hours notice. The high priority areas are the emergency routes and the heavy truck routes. The broadcast will ask all residents to move parked vehicles from the street to assist with the removal process. As a precaution, the Town equipment may leave a ridge around each vehicle that has not been moved to assist with the process to avoid damage. When there is a snowfall of 4" in one instance, the Town may begin snow removal early in the mornings, during the evenings, and on weekends to keep the emergency routes accessible. The Town Office has a route map of the snow removal areas, feel free to stop by and take a look.

ANNUAL PET RENEWAL DUE

Pet renewal licenses are due in January of each year. Please stop by to update information and pay for your pet's license at your earliest convenience. If your pet does not have a tag and is picked up while running at large, it will be sent to the SPCA. If your pet is properly licensed, we will make every effort to return them to you.

COMMUNICATION WITH TOWN OFFICE

The Town Office has been using Dial-My-Calls Broadcasting Service to get information out to the residents of St. Walburg. The service allows the Town Staff to contact many individuals at once, which is time saving. However, the system is only successful with Current Up-to-Date information. Please ensure that proper contact information is in the Town database. In the event of an Emergency, the Town needs to be able to communicate with all residents.

OUTDOOR RINK

The Outdoor Rink is now ready for all to enjoy! The Town has placed signage at the location with some rules that are required for insurance purposes. We will also have Covid-19 Guidelines signage. We need to act collectively to minimize the spread of Covid-19. The Outdoor Rink is for Everyone to enjoy.
