2022 WATER AND SEWER RATE CHANGES

The Town would like to inform all residents of changes to our Water and Sewer rates. The new rates took effect on February 11, 2022, with Saskatchewan Municipal Board approval through bylaw 2022-01. This increase will be in effect for May 2022 usage.

The interest penalty on all outstanding accounts remains at 2% per month.

2022 Water Rate Structure

4 cubic meters or less	\$34.25
Over 4 cubic meters	\$3.91 cu. meter
Bulk Rate per cubic meter	\$9.48

2022 Sewer Rate Structure Residential

4 cubic meters or less	\$25.00
Over 4 cubic meters	\$3.12 cu. Meter

2022 Sewer Rate Structure Commercial

4 cubic meters or less	\$50.00
Over 4 cubic meters	\$3.12 cu. Meter

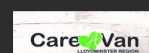

SPRING CLEAN-UP

Thursday, May 17 @ 6:30 p.m. weather permitting (May 24th, 2022 alternate date)

GARBAGE COLLECTION

- Starting June 1st to September 30th, garbage pickup will be Tuesday & Friday. Please have all garbage out by 7 a.m. and in containers to prevent scavengers from ripping open bags.

SCRAP TIRE RECYCLING

If you have scrap tires that you want to get rid of, the "Tire Stewardship of Saskatchewan Program" provides Saskatchewan residents an opportunity to participate in responsible scrap tire recycling. Start gathering the used tires you wish to dispose of on your own property in the coming months. All tires must be:

- Removed from the rim.
- Relatively free of dirt and debris.

If you have more than 500 tires on your property, please let us know and we can arrange pick up at your location. Again, all tires must:

- Removed from the rim.
- Relatively free of dirt and debris

This initiative is tentatively planned for June 2022 to provide enough time to round up the tires. The actual date will be announced closer to June. On the delivery date, the Transfer Site Attendant will direct you to a location at the Transfer Site where you can unload the tires once verified that they meet the no-tim and debris-free criteria. Any tires that do not meet this criterion will not be accepted.

GARDENING TIPS FROM LOCAL EXPERTS

- Take 4 tums, 1/4 cup Epson salts & a cut up a banana peel add water and put into holes before planting tomato plants.
Always plant tomato plants up to their leaves.
- When planting onions, put ashes in the rows before putting your onions. This will prevent worms.
- To get rid of ants, mix 3 tbsp. dawn dish soap, 2 tbsp. baking soda with 1 gallon water. Repeat this two days in a row.
- Plant an onion at each end of row when planting carrot seeds. It will help to mark your rows.
