## THE WATER & SEWER MANAGEMENT BYLAW TOWN OF ST. WALBURG

BYLAW NO. 11-2010

A BYLAW TO REGULATE AND CONTROL THE USE AND CONSUMPTION OF WATER FROM THE MUNICIPALITIES WATERWORKS SYSTEM AND CONTROLLING AND REGULATING THE DISCHARGE OF SEWAGE INTO THE MUNICIPALITIES SEWAGE SYSTEM

The Council of the Town of St. Walburg in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

- 1. This bylaw may be referred to as "The Water & Sewer Management Bylaw".
- In this bylaw, including this section:
  - a. "Municipality" means the Town of St. Walburg.
  - b. "Clerk" means the Clerk/Administrator of the Municipality.
- 3. Persons who want to be supplied with water from the municipal system must make application to the clerk of the municipality.
- Each application shall be accompanied by the payment of a water meter deposit in the sum of: one hundred fifty dollars (\$ 150.00).
- The water meter deposit shall be refunded upon service being discontinued at the request of the consumer, providing that all water usage charges are paid in full.
- The municipality shall have the right to limit the amount of water furnished to any customer, should circumstances seem to warrant such action.
- 7. No person shall discharge into any drain, sewer or sewage system operated by the municipality any harmful matter, substance or thing, whether liquid or solid, that would be injurious to health, life or property, or that would injure, pollute or damage any stream, watercourse, drain, sewer, sewage system or sewage treatment plant.
- Accounts of water service and/or sewer service shall cover a monthly period, and payment shall be rendered upon receipt of bill.
- 9. If an account is not paid within thirty (30) days, the water service shall be cut off and a penalty of 1% per month will accumulate on account. When water service is cut off, service will resume only after the municipality receives payment of outstanding arrears and a reconnection fee of seventy five dollars (\$75.00).
- 10. No person shall open, close, or interfere with any hydrant, gate or water shut-off valve connected with the waterworks, or interfere with any curb stop, pipe or other waterworks appliance outside that person's private premises.
  - Every person who contravenes this provision is guilty of an offence and liable in summary conviction:
    - i. in the case of an individual, to a fine of not more than \$2,000.00 and in the case of a continuing offence, to a further fine of not more than \$250.00 for each day during which the offence continues; and
    - ii. in the case of a corporation, to a fine of not more than \$5,000.00, and in the case of a continuing offence, to a further fine of not more than \$500.00 for each day during which the offence continues.

- iii. in the case of damage to any hydrant, gate or water shut-off valve connected with the waterworks or any curb stop, pipe or other waterworks appliance outside that person's private premises, both individuals and corporations are subject to the full repair cost.
- 11. Any person who contravenes any provision of this bylaw for which no other penalty is provided shall be guilty of an offence and liable upon summary conviction to penalties provided under the "General Penalty Bylaw" of the Municipality.
- 12. Bylaw No. 24-2008 is hereby repealed
- 13. This bylaw shall come into force on the day of its final passing.
