St. Walburg RCMP ATV/MOTORCYCLES

Summer time is here and everyone wants to get out and use their ATV's and Motorcycles. To make sure everyone has a clear understanding, it in an offence under the Traffic Safety Act to operate a motor vehicle without valid insurance or registration on a Highway. It is also on offence to allow someone under the age of 16 years old to

operate a motor vehicle unsupervised. These are not new laws and can result in a substantial fine amount.

A Highway is defined as follows: "highway" means a road, parkway, driveway, square or place designed and intended for or used by the general public for the passage of vehicles, but does not include any area, whether privately or publicly owned, that is primarily intended to be used for the parking of vehicles and the necessary passageways on that area. This means any street or road in the Province of Saskatchewan that is accessible to the public.

Motor Vehicle is defined as follows: " motor vehicle" means a vehicle propelled or driven by any means other than by muscular power.

There is no need to operate an un-registered or un-insured vehicle through town. There is more than enough rural area to operate these vehicles outside of town limits. In my experience a persons driving behavior dictates a Police response so be mindful of how you are operating your motor vehicle. Destruction of private property is a Criminal Code offence, be respectful of where your operating your motor vehicle. An example of this is damage caused by tearing up grass on private property or destroying crops.

Crime is no longer a Police only problem. Be diligent in locking your vehicles and removing any thing of value. Motion sensor lights and cameras are a good deterrent. Report Crime while it is happening. This is important so Police can allocate resources to problem areas.

SCRAP TIRE RECYCLING RM OF MERVIN

If you have scrap tires that you want to get rid of, the "Tire Stewardship of Saskatchewan Program" provides Saskatchewan residents an opportunity to participate in responsible scrap tire recycling. Start gathering the used tires you wish to dispose of on your own property in the coming months. All tires must be:

- Removed from the rim.
- Relatively free of dirt and debris.

If you have more than 500 tires on your property, please let us know and we can arrange pick up at your location. Again, all tires must:

- Removed from the rim.
- Relatively free of dirt and debris

This initiative is tentatively planned for June 2022 to provide enough time to round up the tires. The actual date will be announced closer to June. On the delivery date, the Transfer Site Attendant will direct you to a location at the Transfer Site where you can unload the tires once verified that they meet the no-rim and debris-free criteria. Any tires that do not meet this criterion will not be accepted.
