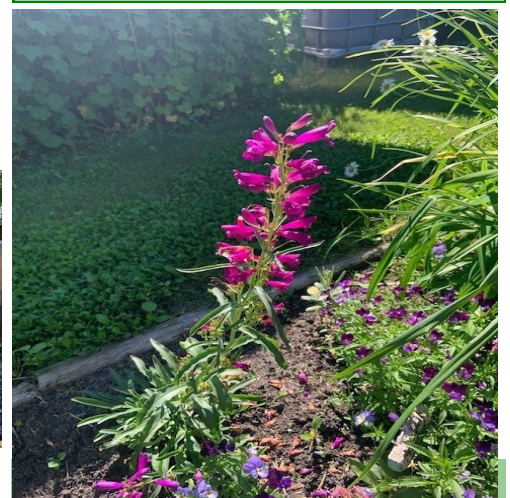

GARDENING TIPS FROM LOCAL EXPERTS

- Onions work extremely well interplanted with carrots. This is a classic companion planting combination predominately for pest control.
- Rotate the plants. Growing the same plant in the same place tires out the soil over the years and also provokes the development of diseases.
- Bleeding Hearts thrive when planted next to a building.
- There are two reasons to deadhead your flowering plants. One is that the plant will immediately look better. The other is that it will reward you with fuller growth and longer blooming time.
- Rose bushes should be covered with burlap to protect them during winter.
- Plant dill & cucumbers together so that the cucumber can crawl up the dill.
- Interplant carrots with beets. Carrots form a deeper root than beets do, so they break up tough soil that allows the beets to thrive.
- Best tip yet! Buy a good hoe.

FIRST DAY—SEPTEMBER 1, 2022

- ⇒ Reduce your speed & use caution as students return to school.
- ⇒ Never overtake other vehicles within a school zone.
- ⇒ Obey posted speed limit and don't use cell phone while driving.
- ⇒ Let kids off away from traffic. Usually, that is the passenger side.
- ⇒ Avoid U-turns in school zones. Children can have a difficult time predicting these types of vehicle maneuvers.

- ◆ Recycling means less trash and saves space in landfills.



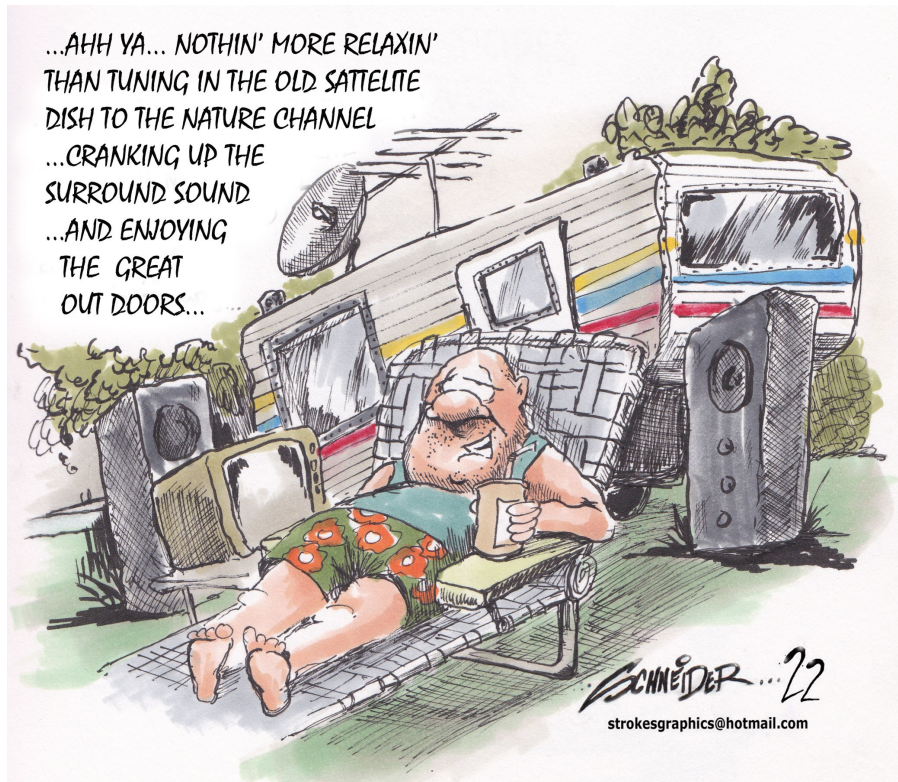
